DECEMBER 2023 NEWSLETTER A few days before Halloween, Carol stopped by a department store to get a small accessory for one of the girl's Halloween costumes. She texted me from the store with a picture of our daughter in front of stacks of boxes of lights and Christmas decorations. "Too late," she wrote, "They already got out the Christmas stuff."

It breaks my heart that we live in a culture that has come to equate the birth of Jesus with the buying and selling of sparkly things. To be clear, I like sparkles as much as the next girl. (Although please don't ever give my children glitter. That's another story.) Still, I want for Christmas to be about more than just how many lights we can cram onto the house, how many cookies we can cram into our mouths, and how many gifts we can cram under the tree.

As you may know, one of my favorite holiday films, "What Would Jesus Buy?" follows a group of performance artists called Rev. Billy and the Stop Shopping Gospel Choir as they seek to show the negative impacts of overconsumption. From that movie, a movement called the Advent Conspiracy began, which encourages people to worship fully, spend less, give more, and love all- to reorient our Christmas preparations from things to people and to our faith.

This Advent, I hope you will join us in re-orienting as well. Our worship on Sundays in December will begin with silence at 9:50. For those who wish to participate, there will be opportunities for praying by walking the labyrinth, exploring art, and lighting candles. Our formation opportunities will help us to remember what the story of Christmas means, and we will have many opportunities to give back to our community. I can't promise that our fellowship gatherings won't have too many Christmas cookies. But I can promise that at St. Stephen's we want a chance to get to know you better- not how much money you have to spend on gifts or how good you are at baking holiday treats.

Christ is coming to make all things new. May he help you be made new as we prepare for his birth this season.

LIBRARY REPORT

Work on the Wolfrum Library is proceeding apace, and while I have put only a fraction of the books in order, the library is getting more user friendly with time. I am using an ad hoc system of ordering; standards like Dewey and Library of Congress systems, designed to systematize all of human writing, are too compressed for a specialized library. The sections are identified by labels, starting with Bibles of various translations, Bible study material (both comprehensive and individual books) and Bible references, such as concordances. Please feel free to avail yourselves of these materials, those in order as well as those pending classification; either read on the spot, or take material home on the honor system.
